

Mission Hills High students share anti-drug message

SAN MARCOS — More than 40 seniors from Mission Hills High School visited San Marcos elementary and middle schools for a Red Ribbon Week program.

The high school and San Marcos Prevention Coalition partnered for the prevention program called “Teen Presenters,” in which the high school students serve as role models to younger students by sharing why they decided to stay away from drugs and alcohol. The teens visited San Marcos Middle School, and Richland, Paloma, Knob Hill, and Twin Oaks elementary schools the week of Oct. 22.
