Take a level approach to understanding



- 30 years ago (University of Mississippi's Marijuana Potency Monitoring Project).
- Dr. Nora Volkow, Director of the National Institute of Drug Abuse, warns the increase in today's marijuana potency may "explain why we've seen a dramatic increase in admission to emergency rooms and treatment programs for marijuana" (NY Times 1.7.13).
- High potency marijuana wax and oil has risen in popularity.
  Marijuana wax and oil are made from a dangerous butane gas extraction process and is typically smoked in vaporizers or electronic cigarettes.
- Synthetic marijuana, or "Spice" and "K2," is dried, shredded plant material with sprayed on chemical additives, which creates an intense psychoactive high and can be lethal (NIDA).
- Today's potent marijuana is more addictive and toxic to our youth's developing brains and bodies.
